

RULES OF THE PARK

The rules of the Borakalalo National Park are there for the protection of its visitors as well as the animals and the environment.

1. **Visitors must remain in their vehicles unless in a designated area.**
2. **Remember that no part of the body may protrude from a window or sunroof or any other part of the vehicle.** Vehicle doors should be closed at all times.
3. **Stick to the speed limit!** All general rules of the road apply within the Borakalalo National Park. The speed limit is 40 km/h but preferred game viewing speed is 10km/ph.
4. **Look at the gate times on your entry permit.** You must be out of the gate before these times. No travelling before or after these times is allowed. Gate times must be strictly adhered to and late comers may be subject to a fine.
5. **You are not allowed to drive "off-road"** or on roads with a "no entry" sign.
6. **The feeding or disturbing of animals is a serious offence.** Remember, animals see litter as food!
7. **Overnight visitors are only allowed to stay at a booked and recognised overnight facility** and must report to reception before occupying accommodation or camping.
8. **Rules and regulations are enforced under the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act no. 57 of 2003)** and transgression can result in a fine.

Borakalalo National Park



Borakalalo which means "Place where people relax", is a 14000-hectare, malaria free National Park, situated 60 km north of Brits.

The unusual eco diverse terrain within the National Park, consists of broad-leaved and Acacia woodland together with the riverside forests along the banks of the Moretele River. The 800-hectare Klipvoor Dam is situated in the Park and is renowned for its excellent fishing.

ACTIVITIES

Angling on both the 800 ha Klipvoor Dam and the Moretele River is permitted and is regarded as being amongst the finest in the country. Carp, bream and barbel are the principal fish species although yellowfish do occur, offering excellent sport when taken on light tackle.

An abundance of wildlife and more than 350 bird species recorded, including 11 eagle and 18 smaller raptors. A wide variety of antelope, giraffe, white rhino, leopard and numerous smaller mammal species.



WHERE TO STAY

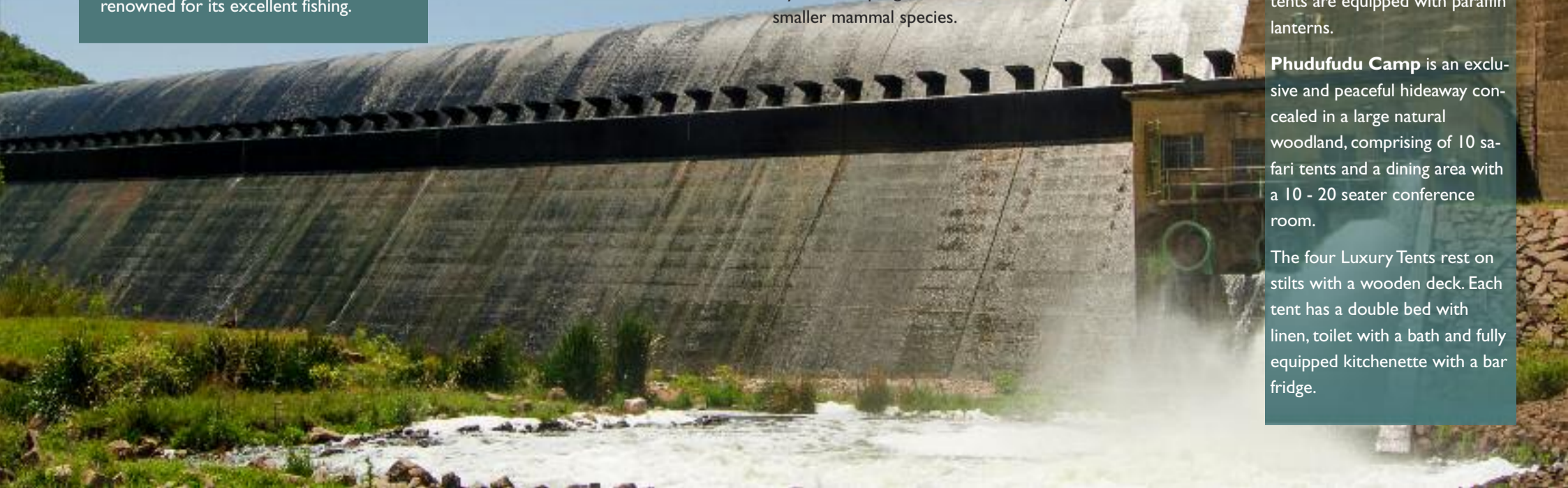
The reserve offers excellent camping facilities and two tented camps..

Moretele Camp is nestled along the banks of the tranquil Moretele River. Amidst Acacia thickets, rest ten Safari Tents.

No electricity is provided and tents are equipped with paraffin lanterns.

Phudufudu Camp is an exclusive and peaceful hideaway concealed in a large natural woodland, comprising of 10 safari tents and a dining area with a 10 - 20 seater conference room.

The four Luxury Tents rest on stilts with a wooden deck. Each tent has a double bed with linen, toilet with a bath and fully equipped kitchenette with a bar fridge.
